Your EHCP Review

Your review



If you have an Education, Health and Care Plan - **EHCP** - it should be reviewed at least every year.



It can be reviewed more often if something big in your life has changed.



An **EHCP** is a plan about:

- your special educational needs
- the support you need
- the outcomes you want



Special educational needs means you need extra help at school or college.

Prepare



Your school or college will help you to get ready for your review meeting.



It is about the things you want to do and the support you need.



Talk about what you have been doing and what you want to do next.
You could use photos, videos or PowerPoint.



If you do not come to your review meeting, someone who knows your views can speak for you.

Your meeting



You can invite your parents or carers.



You can invite other people who are important to you.



Other people who support you will be there. For example, your teacher.



You can say what you like and what you do not like.

Your meeting



Tell people about what support is working and not working.



You will talk about preparing for the future. Tell people about what you might want to do when you are older.



If you don't understand something, then ask people to explain.



This is your plan, and you need to be happy with it.

What next?



You will get a report about the meeting within 2 weeks.



After the meeting, your plan may change, or it may stay the same. If you don't need a plan, it will stop.
